### **Richmond Class Newsletter**

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the start of a new term. I hope you all had a lovely half-term break. The days are getting shorter, and the weather is becoming cooler which can only mean one thing...Christmas will soon be here! I love this term in school. It is always a busy term with all our fantastic learning opportunities as well as our Nativity performance and all things Christmas!



I wanted to take the opportunity to share some important information with yourselves, including information about the learning which will be happening as well as important information you need to know about daily life at school.

# After Dark!



This term our topic is called 'After Dark'. In English we will be looking at fantastic texts such as 'The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark' and 'A Peek Inside Night'. We will use these texts to provide high quality learning opportunities to support your child's reading and writing skills. Children in Year 1 will be refining their use of capital letters and full stops in their sentences and reception children will begin segmenting and writing CVC words. In Science we will be learning about how we can group different animals based on their features and characteristics. We will also be exploring the diets of different

animals and carrying out experiments to decide whether they are carnivores, omnivores, or herbivores. In History we will be exploring why we celebrate bonfire night, who Guy Fawkes is and how we celebrate bonfire night. In Art we will be exploring the artist Van Gogh and exploring his 'Starry Night' artwork. We will be using oil pastels to create our own version of his art. In PE we will be learning how to create a sequence of movements to create a short dance with a partner. We will be looking at different ways to travel and balance to make our dance more appealing to an audience. We will also be learning about why we celebrate Christmas and learn to tell the story through our Nativity.

### Drop off and Pick up



I just wanted to say how proud I am of the new reception children last term with drop off times. Drop off - gate opens at 8.35am for an 8.40am start.

Pick up - gate opens at 3.10pm for a 3.15pm home time.

### Personal Belongings

The weather is starting to get much cooler. Please ensure your child is dressed appropriately for the cooler weather (hats, gloves, scarves etc). As always, we ask that everything is clearly labelled with your child's name so we are able to return any lost items to the correct child. Any unnamed items found within school will be placed in our school lost property box.



### P.E.



Your child will have a P.E. session <u>every</u> week. Year 1 children will have their P.E. sessions on <u>Tuesday</u> and <u>Thursday</u> and Reception children will have their P.E. session on a <u>Tuesday</u>. Your child should bring their P.E. kit into school, where they will get changed into it for our P.E. sessions. We will keep your child's P.E. kit in school for the half term. If your child wears earrings, could I please ask that they are removed before school to keep your child safe within P.E. lessons. Please make sure your child's P.E. kit is

in school for our first P.E. session on Tuesday 4th November.

# Homework

Each week your child will be set homework. They will come home with a yellow homework folder on a **Friday** and this needs to be returned to school by the following **Friday**. 2 dojo points will be given for all

homework returned on time. Reception children will receive a phonics homework and writing homework each week. Year 1 children will receive a piece of phonics and GPS homework in their folder. Year 1 will also have maths homework set via the online app Sumdog. Log ins for your child's Sumdog account can be found in their homework folders. We will be participating in the school wide contests again. We have already participated in the whole school Sumdog competition this year and have come so close to winning the trophy. Let's see if we can win it this term!
