Introduction

This plan is based on the <u>DfE's Contingency Framework</u> which lays out how to manage local outbreaks of COVID-19. The guidance states schools should have "outbreak management plans", outlining "how they would operate" if any of the measures described in the guidance were recommended for their setting or area.

The contingency framework (latest edition) states that councils, directors of public health and Public Health England health protection teams can recommend certain measures for individual schools or clusters of settings. This plan was recommended by Lincolnshire Public Health on 17th November 2021.

Current DFE guidance states that a localised school outbreak is: 'whichever of these thresholds is reached first:

- 5 children, pupils, students or staff, who are likely to have mixed closely, test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period; or
- 10% of children, pupils, students or staff who are likely to have mixed closely test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period'

It may be necessary to implement these measures in the following circumstances:

- To help manage a COVID-19 outbreak within the school
- If COVID-19 infection rates in the community are extremely high, and other measures have failed to reduce transmission

Increased cleaning Although the school will continue to maintain increased daily cleaning, the public health teams may require further increase at shorter intervals. Reduce mixing of students It is noted that under current guidance, there is no longer any need for reduced mixing for pupils. However, in some cases, health protection teams may recommend that bubbles are put in place for a period whilst the outbreak is in place. Staggered arrival and departure times until the review of the risk assessment after two-weeks once contingency plans are implemented. Reduction of wider school activities Public Health Teams advise schools to reduce their timetable to normal school day activities. This may mean limiting: • Residential educational visits • Open days • Transition or taster days • Parents coming into school • Live performances	The school will ensure communication to stakeholder via email and on-line messaging (where possible) to ensure communications are received in good time. The entire teaching time have spent a considerable time reviewing and discussing live performances that include parents coming into school. Due to the present high number of cases that are still rising and the risk to the school community so close to Christmas, the staff have decided that the performances will be filmed and shown as a live performance or as a video recording.
