

Dear Hyde Class Parents,

I hope you had a restful half term! Here's hoping the weather starts to improve now after a very wet January and February.

Curriculum



In **English**, we will be using text-based writing and exploring the book 'Coming to England' by Floella Benjamin to inspire an informal letter and a narrative.

Mathematics this term focuses on decimals and percentages. The children will learn how decimals represent parts of a whole, such as 0.1, 0.5 and 0.75, and how these link closely to percentages. They will discover that percentages simply mean "out of 100," and they'll practise converting between fractions, decimals and percentages with increasing confidence.

Our topic this term is **History** based and it is continuing with learning about '**The Pilgrim Fathers**' and how this links to local history and Boston. We will be exploring more around the Separatists relationship with the Natives when they arrived at the New World and how they survived the first year. To deepen this learning, we will be visiting the Boston Guildhall, where some of the Pilgrims were held, giving the children a chance to explore this important local link.



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Science focuses on recognising the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their body's function. We will explore how a balanced diet provides the nutrients needed for energy, growth and overall health and how regular exercise strengthens muscles, supports the heart and improves wellbeing. They will also learn about the effects of different substances on the body and why some choices can be harmful.

Alongside these lessons and subjects, we will also be exploring new ideas in RE (Is technology a good thing for religious views?), Music, DT (Looking and making alarm systems), MFL, PE (Tennis) and PHSE (E-safety).



Personal Belongings

Please can you make sure that **everything** is clearly labelled with your child's name, so we are able to return any lost items to the correct child, unfortunately if they are not named it becomes difficult to hand them back! Please make sure your child has a coat in school due to the changing of weather!

PE

This term PE will be on a **Monday and Thursday afternoon**; we will be focusing on Tennis. Please ensure your child has a complete P.E. kit (white T-shirt and blue/black shorts) in school suitable for both indoor and outdoor PE i.e. tracksuit bottoms as we will try and get outside as much as possible. As items of clothing are regularly 'misplaced', please ensure each item of clothing is clearly labelled.

Please ensure children have a PE kit in school all week as there may be times when PE kit is required on non-PE days, it also helps towards any clubs children do if they forget their clothes for a club.



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
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Reading

Please ensure your child brings in their Reading Record and current reading book to school every day as this will enable us to monitor your child's reading development and progress throughout the term and year. To encourage reading at home, we will also be awarding five Dojo points each day to any child that has read at home and has had their reading record signed. To encourage the love of reading, children can read a book from home as well as their schoolbook. If they complete a book at home, we will always look to see if there is an accelerated reader quiz to go with it. In year 6, the ownership is on the children, they will choose their own schoolbook from the library within their ZPD score range. Please encourage your child to read at home or sign their reading record if they have read.

Homework will still be set on Friday and is due in the following Wednesday. Each child will receive Maths, English and spellings each week. Spelling tests will be on a Friday.
